Volunteer Check-In

Please check in with the volunteer coordinator before your shift. Please plan to arrive 10 minutes before your shift to receive training and instructions. *Two exceptions apply:*

- Water station volunteers will follow their group captain instructions for reporting for their water station shift, and will not check in with the volunteer coordinator on race day.
- Marathon and half marathon course marshals will check in on Friday or Saturday at the Health
 and Wellness Expo to receive their t-shirt and special instructions for their shift location. On
 Sunday, course marshals will go directly to their designated course location at the assigned time.

Parking

Hayward Field

- <u>Saturday</u>: Eugene 5K & Kids Duck Dash presented by OCCU There is metered street parking around Hayward Field on Saturdays. Additionally, many UO parking lots are available and free to the public on weekends. Read signs carefully.
- <u>Sunday</u>: Marathon & Half Marathon Parking around Hayward Field on Sunday will be limited and parking violators will be towed. Many UO lots are free to park on Sunday read signs carefully. A free bike valet is available at the starting line.

Graduate Hotel - Health & Wellness Expo

- Friday: Parking is available at the Parcade and Hult Center parking garages, rates are low (the
 first hour is free at the Parcade). Metered parking is also available on the street and in a public
 lot across Oak St from the Graduate.
- Saturday: All city garages and street parking are free.

Preparing for your assignment

- By volunteering at the Eugene Marathon, you automatically are assuming a role as a community and race ambassador. Please come ready to treat all spectators, participants, guests, and other volunteers with respect and courtesy. Please wear your volunteer t-shirt and pants or shorts without holes.
- Please check the forecast and come dressed appropriately for the weather. The Eugene Marathon will happen regardless of weather conditions (unless it creates an unsafe environment).
- Please bring snacks and hydration sufficient for your shift length. Please refrain from eating while
 working, but you are welcome to take breaks at appropriate times to eat. We are unable to
 provide meals, regardless of shift length. No tobacco or alcoholic beverages.
- Please visit the <u>volunteer training page</u> for useful training videos and other information. If the volunteer coordinator sent you additional information regarding your shift, please read through it carefully.
- As a volunteer, you may be asked lots of questions. Prepare to answer them by visiting our website, <u>eugenemarathon.com</u>, ahead of time. Look through the pages under the "Race Weekend" tab, and familiarize yourself with the race maps under the "Races" tab. If at any time you don't know the answer, seek out a marathon staff member or the volunteer coordinator. Customer service is a priority!
- Authorized service animals are always welcome, but please leave your pets at home.
- We are counting on your help! If you are unable to fulfill your shift, please cancel it in <u>VolunteerHub</u>. If it is less than 48 hours notice, please email <u>volunteer@eugenemarathon.com</u>.
